Recreation Privileges

Welcome to Incline Village General Improvement District Recreation Services

Incline Village General Improvement District (IVGID) residents and property owners enjoy a vast array of recreational facilities and programs. Included are world-class golf, downhill skiing, some of Tahoe's most beautiful beaches, a nationally recognized Tennis Center, and a Recreation Center that houses an indoor pool, sauna, gymnasium, aerobics classroom, and fitness area. Also available are a boat ramp, lakeside swimming pool, hunting club, athletic fields, skateboard park, hiking and exercise trails, group meeting facilities, children's programs, and sports ranging from aerobics to volleyball.

All of these recreation services, and many more, are provided by IVGID, which is a political subdivision of the State of Nevada. IVGID was created to, among other things, serve the recreational needs of local property owners and residents. IVGID offers its owners, residents, and guests special ways to access many of these facilities and services, at rates far below what is available elsewhere.

IVGID offers a variety of recreational services and privileges. Indeed, given the high quality, low cost, and diversity of recreation offered, the package may not only be a privilege, but one of the best values available in the recreational resort industry!

This brochure is meant to help you take advantage of these Incline Village recreation privileges.

Your Recreation Fee

Along with the substantial recreation privileges available to IVGID property owners comes a financial responsibility. As an IVGID property owner, you are currently assessed an annual fee to support local recreation facilities and services. The amount can change from year to year dependant upon the District's financial needs. Any such change would be open to public input and would require a vote by the IVGID Board of Trustees. The method for collecting the recreation fee changed in 2001. Instead of the entire fee being collected with the first installment of property tax, it is now collected in four equal installments with the property tax.

How Your Fee Is Used

The revenue resulting from this annual recreation fee is applied by IVGID to three types of recreation expenses: retirement of debt incurred to buy land or build facilities, physical improvements, and subsidies for programs which are not self-supporting. While your fee may be used to support any IVGID recreation facility or service, IVGID has a long-term objective of making these recreation facilities, the two golf courses, ski resort, Tennis Center, the Chateau and Aspen Grove completely self-supporting. On the other hand, the Recreation Center, beaches, pool, parks and youth programs currently require subsidies.

Get Involved

IVGID listens carefully to property owners, residents and recreation users. Annual hearings are held and several opportunities are provided for public input during the budget and fee-setting processes. Recreation Photo IDs and Recreation Punch Cards

IVGID recreation privileges are available in two forms: a photo identification pass and a punch card.

Recreation Photo ID

The Recreation Photo ID is like a driver's license which can only be used by the person to whom it has been issued. It offers the following privileges:

- Free admission to Incline Beach, Ski Beach and Burnt Cedar Beach and pool area for the pass holder, and guest admission for a fee.
- Reduced rates for golf, ski, tennis, hunting, recreational programs and the Recreation Center, on either a daily or seasonal basis.
- Reduced rates for rental of the Chateau, Aspen Grove building and park area and all athletic fields.
- Boat ramp access at Ski Beach for a fee.

Your Recreation Photo ID can be issued for a term of six months to five years. If lost or stolen, you may receive another pass for a \$15 replacement fee.

Recreation Punch Card

The Recreation Punch Card is a transferable card that can be used by anyone who possesses it. It has an initial stored value of 1/5 of the annual Recreation Fee and the value is reduced with each use. The Recreation Punch Card can be used to pay for any of the following privileges:

- The full cost of access to the beaches, pool and boat launching fees.
- The difference between standard rates and "IVGID Pass" daily or hourly rates at the Recreation Center, Tennis Center, golf courses and Diamond Peak. The discounted rate must still be paid.
- The card may be used at both golf facilities, but the difference between the standard and IVGID Pass rate will consume either most or all of the value of the card.

Each Recreation Punch Card is issued for one-year that begins June 1st through the following May 31st. It cannot be replaced if completely used. If lost or stolen, the Recreation Punch Card can be replaced for a \$15 fee. Recreation Punch Cards are issued to recorded property owners and authorized agents only.

Who receives Recreation Privileges?

IVGID grants a limited amount of privileges to each property. All single family residence parcels are allotted a combined total of five Recreation Photo IDs and/or Recreation Punch Cards. As a property owner, you may assign your privileges to yourself, members of your family, or to your long-term tenants. Only properties within IVGID boundaries are eligible. All fees, taxes, and assessments must be current to retain Recreation Privileges. All privileges expire at the time ownership ceases. Since most IVGID services are free to children under six, Recreation Photo IDs are only issued to persons aged six and older.

Additional Recreation Privileges

Property owners may purchase additional Recreation Photo IDs or Recreation Punch Cards by paying an additional amount, (one-fifth the current Recreation fee), for each Photo ID or Punch Card requested. Recreation Photo IDs may only be purchased for people in the Family Tree. These additional Photo IDs and Punch Cards do not allow any golf privileges. The purchased Recreation Photo IDs are valid for one year from the date of purchase. The Recreation Punch Cards are valid from the day you purchase until the expiration date of the card.

“No Beach” Properties

Certain properties within IVGID’s boundaries, for example Crystal Bay properties, are designated as “No Beach” properties. This is due to a deed restriction which limits beach access to properties that were within the District at the time the beaches were purchased in 1968. The properties that were outside the District at the time the beaches were purchased are considered “No Beach” properties and any passes issued against these properties do not include beach access.

Ownership

All Recreation Photo IDs and Recreation Punch Cards remain the property of IVGID and must be returned upon request, or when your eligibility to receive privileges expires.

Fraudulent Use

False or misleading information to obtain a Recreation Photo ID or Recreation Punch Card, or any fraudulent use of such Punch Card or Photo ID, will be grounds for voiding all recreation privileges issued against the parcel for a period up to one (1) full year. The District reserves the right to pursue any other legal action. It is strictly forbidden for any individual to sell an assignment of Recreation Privileges, or to sell individual Recreation Photo IDs or Recreation Punch Cards. Any such sale of privileges, Photo IDs, or Punch Cards is considered to be fraudulent use and will be grounds for voiding all recreation privileges issued against the parcel. The District reserves the right to pursue any other legal action.

Misconduct

Use of the District's facilities by any pass holder is a privilege that may be revoked or suspended at the sole discretion of the District. Users may be removed from the facilities and/or their privileges may be suspended or revoked for misconduct or misuse of the facilities, for any period deemed appropriate by the District. All recreation privileges pertaining to a specific parcel may be suspended or revoked, if misconduct or misuse results from the exercise of any privileges pertaining to that parcel. The privileges of parents may be suspended or revoked if a child engages in misconduct or misuse, regardless of whether the parents' and child's privileges pertain to the same parcel. Said misconduct or misuse includes, but is not limited to: failure to abide by any rule or regulation established by the District; violation of any law or ordinance; disorderly and/or abusive behavior; excessive or improper use of alcohol and/or drugs; or vandalism or any other form of property damage.

How to Get Your Recreation Photo ID

Get a Form

If you own property within IVGID, all you need to get started is an Assignment of Recreation Privileges Form and your Grant Bargain Sale Deed from your escrow papers. If you do not own property, ask your landlord to apply for you. Return the Form with Ownership Papers

On the Assignment of Recreation Privileges Form, list who is to receive the Recreation Photo IDs, fill out the information portion, sign it and attach a copy of your Grant Bargain Sale Deed and return it to the Parks & Recreation Department.

Issuance

Once your application has been submitted, anyone you've listed to receive privileges may come by the Parks & Recreation Department office to pick up their Recreation Photo ID. The office is open Monday through Saturday from 8:30 am - 5:00 pm Memorial Day through Labor Day. After Labor Day Saturday hours change to 12:00 pm – 5:00 pm for fall/winter.

Multiple Owners

Any recorded owner of your property can apply for recreation privileges. If you are a co-owner, you may want to coordinate the privileges with the other owners. Privileges are assigned on a first-come, first-served basis. If you are not the first owner to apply, IVGID will be happy to issue you any privileges not already issued to another owner, but it cannot issue more than the five privileges that are allotted to the property.

Agents

If you plan on renting out your property, you may designate an agent to administer the process for you. Just request an Agent Authorization form from the Parks & Recreation Department.

Renters/Tenants

Have your agent or homeowner fill out the Assignment of Recreation Privileges form and specify a term of eligibility. Bring the form along with a copy of your current valid lease agreement to the Parks & Recreation Department. Recorded property owners determine who receives the recreation privileges, so Recreation Photo IDs and Recreation Punch Cards are not guaranteed to be available to all tenants.

Returning Previously Issued Passes

To avoid delays, if you are selling your property make sure all of the previously issued Recreation Photo IDs and Recreation Punch Cards on your parcel are returned to the Parks & Recreation Department. You will be required to pay a fee to invalidate all previous Photo IDs and Punch Cards that are not returned. This is usually handled in the escrow process. If you are a new owner and the previous owner did not remit the old passes at the time of closing, there will be a fee to void any Recreation Photo IDs or Recreation Punch Cards previously issued.

If you would like to return a Recreation Photo ID to make space for another family member or tenant, you may do so only after six months of issuance, (you will be required to pay a fee if the pass is not returned). Recreation Punch Cards can be returned, however, there is a fee + the total dollar amount of punches used.

Your Recreation Fee at Work

Your Recreation Fee is used to support the various recreational venues available to the property owners and residents of Incline Village/Crystal Bay community.

Your Beach Fee is used to support beach operations for Burnt Cedar, Incline, and Ski Beaches.

Both fees are annually charged and billed on your Washoe County property tax bills and are listed as separate items. Billing the Recreation Fee and Beach Fee on the Washoe County property tax bill is a cost effective method to keep the cost of administrating the Recreation Fee and Beach Fee down.

The following two allocation tables summarize how the two fees break out among operations, capital expenditures, and debt service on a per parcel/dwelling unit basis and by recreational venue.

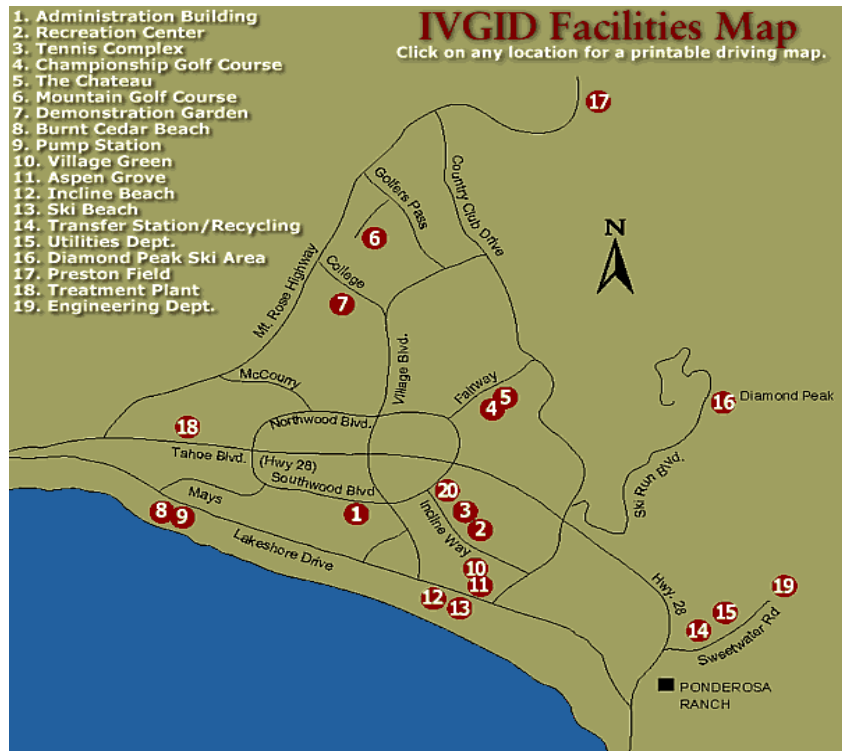
